
The First Step: Celebrate!


Knowledge of ARs is increasing rapidly

Before the Content is Finalized... We* Submit the Proposal Submission Package

- Expected completion date
- Anticipated length
- Author CVs
- Detailed chapter outlines
- 1 to 2 lines "take-home" points from each chapter

- 1 or 2 sample chapters (3rd stage of revision)
- Summary of book's integration within existing AR body of work
- Potential markets

The Pitch to UC Press (or other Press/Publisher)

 What goes into the PSP is LARGELY determined by the most coherent and informative chapters

 Those who develop and submit their chapters on time and follow the logistics of the publication schedule will be the biggest influencers of the final work.

This is all about YOU!

- To "Make" the book, we need YOUR CONTENT → CHAPTERS
 - We have roughly one-third of the book
 - We need roughly two-thirds of the book
